This is achieved mostly at the expense of the personal welfare of teachers. Of course, as the saying goes, "a good teacher is like a candle; it consumes itself to light the way for others".

As I conclude I want to remind our teachers, that for our nation to develop, we all need to play our individual roles and do so to the best of our ability. Let us all discipline ourselves to do what is right and important, although difficult. I also urge our teachers to also take advantage of the various opportunities for continuous education and self-development in order to sharpen your teaching skills in these times of constant change. This way, you will always remain current and will be in a better position to impart modern and relevant knowledge to your learners.

Lastly, I want to take this opportunity to appreciate the role of all Teacher Unions in the manner in which they supported the National Teaching Awards. Our Teacher Unions are our important and valued stakeholders and we want to thank you for your dedication to the noble cause of educating our nation.
