- Using a friends exam number or a wrong exam number and;
- If you do not sit according to the seating plan.

It is also very important to warn you against accepting answers that are imposed on you by anyone. Do not accept imposed answers. If you accept answers imposed on you, the following will be the consequences:

1. The imposed answers will definitely be detected at the marking centre. The system has advanced ways of detecting such answers.

2. Your results in the implicated subject/paper will be blocked for further investigation.
3. The investigation and hearings are a long process which may be concluded after the opening of tertiary institutions.
4. As you will be waiting for the outcome of the hearings, other 2016 matric students will be busy with their first year tertiary education studies.
5. This means that your life will come to a complete standstill as you will be waiting for the outcome of the investigations and hearings.
6. If you are found guilty of accepting imposed answers, your results will be declared null and void.
7. You may be barred from writing the National Senior Certificate examination for a period on one or two or three years depending of the decision of the Chairperson of the hearing committee.

8. You will be given an opportunity to appeal the decisions taken by the hearing committee. This is another long-drawn process which will further delay your results.

9. Whilst waiting for the outcome of your appeal, your peers will be continuing with their tertiary education studies.

10. The fact of the matter is that you may lose 1 year of your plans or even 2 or 3 years depending on the outcome of the appeal process.

It is therefore apparent that accepting imposed answers can easily destroy your life whilst the persons who imposed the answers on you are unaffected and continue with their lives.

The Department of Education hopes that this Pledge Signing Ceremony will make you aware of the dangers of any irregularities and salvage you from the frustrations of waiting for the long processes of investigations and hearings.

In conclusion, you do have a choice. Make the right decision.

Be honest, be trustworthy, be a person of character and integrity.

Be calm before the examination, arrive on time for the examination and have your identity document and admission letter with you at all times.
